

Arizona Election Data Guide

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Arizona provides statewide election data back to 1912, including voter registration counts, unofficial election night results, official canvasses of election results, and an archive of precinct-level results. The data are published by the Arizona Secretary of State across two hosts: azsos.gov carries election information pages and registration reports, and results.arizona.vote carries unofficial results for elections from 2016 forward. Arizona does not publish its voter registration file online; access is restricted by [A.R.S. § 16-168](#) to political and other statutorily authorized uses, on request and for a fee. The state's machine-readable precinct-level results end with the 2016 general election. For later elections, precinct-level data comes from the counties; the two largest, Maricopa and Pima, are covered in their own sections of this report. The state's and Maricopa's election sites sit behind a security service (Cloudflare) that blocks automated download tools, so their files generally require a web browser rather than a script to download. Pima's sites do not. In the data descriptions below, we identify the locations of the data and their dedicated webpages.

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Statewide

Election Results

Description

Unofficial election night results for statewide elections from 2016 forward are listed in the "Historical Election Information" index at results.arizona.vote. Primary, general, special, and presidential preference elections are covered. Elections from the 2018 primary forward are served by an interactive application, one unique numeric election ID per election;¹ the 2016 general and primary are static HTML pages with the same tables. The 2016 presidential preference and May 2016 special elections link to official canvass PDFs instead. Results are reported statewide and by county, with a breakdown by vote type. Precinct-level results are not included. Each primary and general election since the 2018 primary also links a Ballot Progress page reporting counties' estimates of uncounted ballots, updated from election night until counting ends. Results pages remain live after each election with the final unofficial totals.

¹ In other words, each election is identified with a unique ID number that is unrelated, for instance, to the date of the election.

Precincts Reporting / Voter Turnout

A summary bar reports statewide Precincts Reporting, Registered Voters, Ballots Cast, and Voter Turnout; clicking it opens a county table. The variables displayed for the 2024 general election as of July 17, 2026 are:

Notes for use

- + There is no advertised bulk download and no precinct-level data. The application is fed by JSON files under `results.arizona.vote/data/<election ID>/`. The one machine-readable results file the office has posted is the 2020 general election Results Detail file, which is available as a zipped XML with county-level results by vote type for every contest:
https://apps.azsos.gov/election/2020/resultsdetail_2020generalxml.zip. No equivalent exists for other elections.
- + Ballot Progress figures are county-reported estimates under [A.R.S. § 16-551\(D\)](#), and are blank until a county first reports. Provisional ballots awaiting verification are counted separately from early ballots left to process; not all of either ballot type will qualify for tabulation, so the estimated-uncounted column overstates the eventual count.

Official Canvasses and Election Information Pages

Description

Each state election back to 1974 has an election information page carrying the official statewide canvass as a PDF. Recent pages carry additional files: the 2024 general election page carries the signed statewide canvass, one canvass PDF per county, hand count (post-election audit) results by county under [A.R.S. § 16-602](#), recount court orders

and reports, candidate lists, and ballot measure proclamations. Pages for 1998–2016 are static pages hosted on apps.azsos.gov; pages for 1974–1996 hold scanned canvass PDFs under apps.azsos.gov/election/files/hist/.

Variables

The canvasses are certified report PDFs rather than data files. The statewide canvass opens with the Secretary of State's certification of the tabulation and reports the official vote totals by contest; county canvass PDFs are the counties' certified returns as transmitted to the state.

Notes for use

- + Canvasses are published only as PDFs. The 2020, 2022, and 2024 pages carry no spreadsheet version; the only machine-readable official-results file is the 2020 Results Detail XML described under Election Results.
- + The Maricopa County canvass for the 2022 general election is split across two PDFs.

Precinct-Level Election Results

Description

Precinct-level results by county for state elections from 2000 through 2016, in browsable directories on apps.azsos.gov. Each election's directory holds one file or subdirectory per county plus a layout document describing the file formats. The files are raw exports from the counties' vote tabulation systems, and the export format follows each county's election management system (EMS). In the 2016 general election, ten counties exported

fixed-width files produced by the ElectionWare EMS, three exported files produced by the GEMS EMS, Maricopa County exported files produced by the WinEDS EMS, and Yavapai County exported files produced by the OpenElect EMS. Elections from 2008 back also publish contest-level HTML summary pages alongside the county files. Precinct-level files after 2016 are not provided. For precinct-level results in recent elections, see the Maricopa and Pima sections of this guide and other county election sites.

Notes for use

- + Different counties will require different parsing. Even within the ElectionWare fixed-width layout, field positions and order differ: Apache carries the two DS200 columns and puts Polling Place Votes before Early Votes, while Cochise omits DS200 and reverses that order. Per-county start and end positions are in the layout workbook.
- + Layouts change from election to election. Each directory's layout document ("!File Formats for County Results.doc" in earlier years) applies only to that election; the 2000–2006 elections put each county in its own subdirectory with additional layout notes.

Voter Registration Counts

Description

Reports of registered voters by party, published roughly quarterly and before each state election, with counts by county and by congressional and legislative district. Active and inactive voters are reported separately. Reports are available as PDF and CSV back to February 2000 and as PDF back to 1999. The 1998 cycle is a single pre-general PDF. A separate federal-only report, published since October 2019, counts registrants who have not provided documented proof of citizenship, of residency, or of both, and is PDF only. Additionally, "Voter Registration 1912 to 2012 ~ Centennial Edition" reconstructs registration by county for every general and primary election back to statehood.

Notes for use

- + The CSVs are formatted report exports: title rows, blank spacer columns, county names only on the first of each county's three rows, and quoted thousands separators necessitate cleaning before use.

- + Party columns track the parties recognized at the time, and their order varies between files: the 2000 report carries Natural Law and Reform columns, No Labels appears from 2023, and the 2010 files put Green first and mask some of its values with an asterisk.
- + Format labels on the download links are unreliable. Several links labeled CSV serve Excel workbooks (the January 2023 through April 2024 reports and the January 2016 report), and the April 2023 CSV link points to the July 2023 file.
- + In the centennial series, an asterisk marks totals that do not reconcile with the scanned source document.

Voter Registration File

Description

Arizona does not publish its voter registration file online. [A.R.S. § 16-168](#) limits precinct registers and any information derived from registration forms to uses relating to political activity, campaigns, elections, or redistricting, or other uses specifically authorized by law; commercial use and republication on the internet are prohibited, and violations are a class 6 felony. On a [request](#) for an authorized use, the Secretary of State or a county recorder must furnish copies within thirty days at fees set by the statute. Voter history is likewise available only through such a request, not as a published file.

Dedicated webpage

There is no dedicated page. Requests to the Secretary of State go through its public records portal at <https://azsos.nextrequest.com>; requests can also be made to individual county recorders (Pima County's request form is noted in its section below). The access rules and fee schedule are in [A.R.S. § 16-168](#).

Variables

No file layout is published. The statute excludes from any release: month and day of birth, Social Security number, driver's license or nonoperating identification number, Indian census number, father's name and mother's maiden name, state or country of birth, signature, and e-mail address.

Notes for use

- + Submitting a request through the records portal requires creating an account.

Voter List Maintenance Reports

Description

Quarterly reports to the Legislature on voter list maintenance, required by [A.R.S. § 16-165\(M\)](#) and published since Q1 2023. Each is a letter-format PDF reporting statewide counts of registration cancellations and related notices by cause.

Variables

Each report gives statewide counts of:

- + Deaths reported by the Department of Health Services, cancellation notices issued to county recorders, and registrations canceled as a result
- + Persons issued a driver license or nonoperating identification in another state, notices sent, registrations placed in inactive status, and registrations canceled
- + Persons stating on a jury questionnaire that they are not a United States citizen, notices sent, and registrations canceled
- + Persons stating on a jury questionnaire that they are not a resident of the county, notices sent, and registrations canceled
- + Inactive-list registrations canceled

Notes for use

- + The reports are letters, not tables; figures must be transcribed. File URLs are site media IDs with no clear pattern.

Maricopa County

Maricopa County publishes its election data through the Elections Department at <https://elections.maricopa.gov>, with live registration tables served from the Recorder's legacy site and spatial data on a county open data portal. It is the only source of precinct-level Maricopa results after 2016.

Election Results Archive

Description

Results and post-election reports for every county-run election from 2000 through 2026, selected by year from a dropdown archive. For recent elections each election's set includes the Board of Supervisors canvass summary, a Final Official Summary Report, the Final Statement of Vote (SOV) and Official Canvass Report, early voting rejection reports (summary and detailed), provisional ballot reports (summary, detailed, and totals by facility), vote center early ballot drop-off estimates, the Election Management System audit event log, and recount results. Jurisdictional elections (city and town) get their own summary and SOV files.

Notes for use

- + File URLs are opaque asset identifiers (elections.maricopa.gov/asset/jcr:...), so the archive dropdown is the only index and there is no clear URL pattern.
- + Each SOV .txt ships with a FILE DESCRIPTION PDF documenting the layout; layouts before the current tabulation system (2020 and earlier archives) differ. The four vote-type columns at the end (Turnout/Overvotes/Undervotes/Votes per counting group) are named after the election's user-defined counting groups, so their headings can change between elections.

Voter Registration Totals

Description

Live registration tables updated every five minutes, reporting active, inactive, and Active Early Voting List voters by party for each congressional district, city or town, legislative district, supervisorial district, justice of the peace district, elementary and high school district, voting precinct, zip code, fire district, technical education district, and high school ward, plus federal-only voter totals by congressional district. The page also archives the county's periodic registration snapshots (three per year as required by [A.R.S. § 16-168\(G\)](#)).

Notes for use

- + The tables are HTML pages. Precinct-level early ballot request and return counts are downloadable from the county's open data portal (see [Spatial Data and Early Voting Returns](#)).

Spatial Data and Early Voting Returns

Description

The county's ArcGIS open data portal carries election-tagged layers maintained by the Recorder's Office and refreshed weekly. Voting precinct boundaries are published in a series of era layers, alongside supervisor districts, justice precincts, zip codes, and precinct-level census demographics. The precinct layers cover uneven spans—two-year buckets from 1998–1999 through 2006–2007, then longer ones (2008–2011, 2012–2017, 2018–2021, 2022–2025) up to the current 2026–present layer. During elections, the portal also serves Early Voting Returns layers—early ballot requests and returns by precinct for the currently active election, in an all-voters version and Republican and Democratic versions. Each layer downloads as CSV, GeoJSON, KML, shapefile, or file geodatabase, or is queryable through an ArcGIS REST endpoint.

Notes for use

- + The Early Voting Returns layers cover only the currently active election and are overwritten; there is no archive of past elections' return curves.
- + Precinct boundaries change between the era buckets; joins across redistrictings need the era layer matching the election. Legislative and congressional district boundaries are not on the portal—they are published by the Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission at <https://irc.az.gov/>.

Pima County

Pima County splits its election publishing: the Elections Department posts results and post-election reports at pima.gov, and the Recorder posts registration and early voting statistics at recorder.pima.gov. It is the only source of precinct-level Pima results after 2016.

Election Results and Data

Description

Per-election results and reports from 2010 through 2026, organized in year tabs. For recent elections, each set includes summary results as PDF and CSV, a precinct-level statement of votes cast (SOVC), the county's official canvass PDF, early ballots processed and provisional ballots processed reports, vote center early ballot drop-off totals, hand count audit reports, audit event reports, and vote center location spreadsheets. County and jurisdictional elections report live on the county's election night page at livevoterturnout.com; state-run contests link to results.arizona.vote.

Variables

The 2024 general election summary results file is a wide-format precinct CSV. Its leading columns are:

- + COUNTY NUMBER [Contains the county name]
- + PRECINCT CODE [Contains the count group: EARLY, ELECTION DAY, PROVISIONAL, or Total]
- + PRECINCT NAME
- + REGISTERED VOTERS TOTAL
- + BALLOTS CAST TOTAL
- + BALLOTS CAST BLANK
- + One column per candidate or ballot option, grouped by contest, with Write-in, OVER VOTES, and UNDER VOTES columns in each contest group

Notes for use

- + Download links labeled Excel can serve CSV; check the bytes, not the label.
- + File URLs are opaque asset identifiers on content.civicplus.com or pima.gov/asset/, with no constructable pattern. Older pima.gov paths (the /2054/ series) return HTTP 200 with a 404 body after a 2025–2026 site migration; validate content, not status codes.

Recorder Voter Statistics

Description

The Recorder's Voter Statistics section carries an early voting statistics table covering every state election from 1996 forward, interactive party registration lookups by precinct and by district, and, during elections, ballot processing reports and ballot turnover receipts. A Request for Voter Data page handles county-level voter file requests under [A.R.S. § 16-168](#).

- + The party totals lookups render only after an in-page form submission and offer no file download; extraction means scraping the returned HTML table per jurisdiction.
